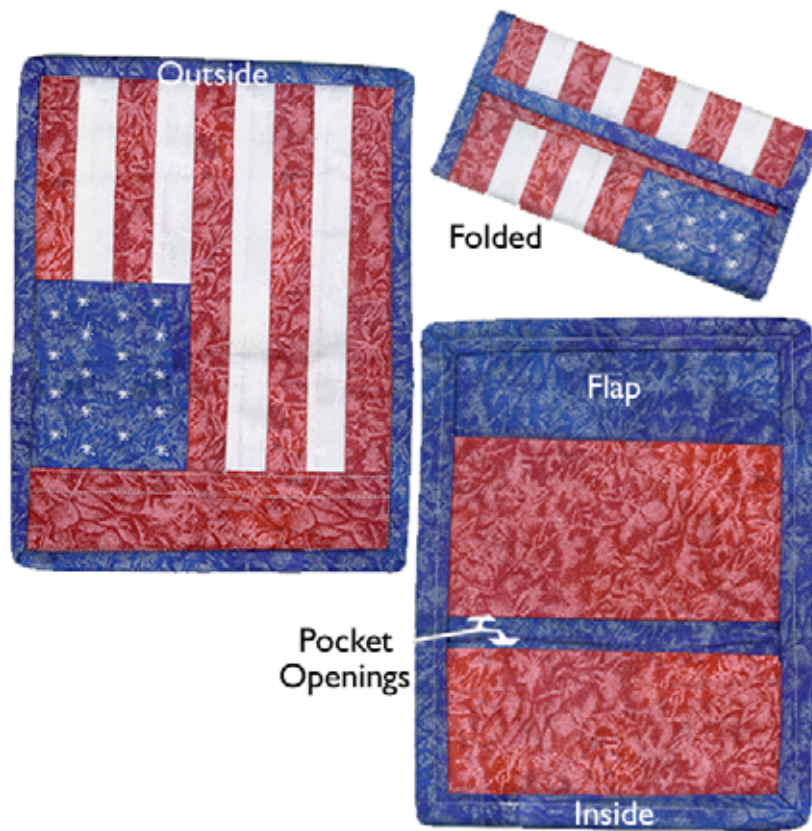


# Freedom Flag Wallet Pattern

**Fabrics:**

Blue (1) 6½" x 8½", (1) 4" x 3 ¼,

Red (1) 1½" x 44", (1) 2" x 7", (1) 6½" x 7"  
(1) 6½" x 6",

White (1) 1¼" x 44",

Binding (1) 2¼" x 44" Blue or red .

One piece of Thin batting 6½" x 8½".

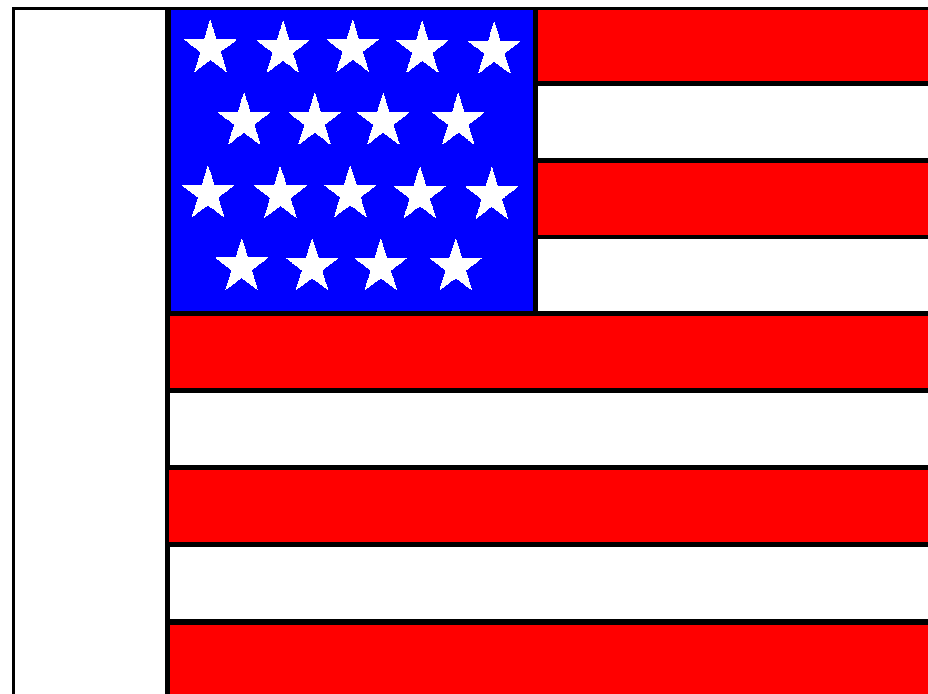

**EASY**



Wallet or Check book cover.

Copy or trace wallet pattern.

Sew fabrics to foundation.

Trim to exact size. Use Velcro as closures for your wallet. I use one inch wide and one inch long pieces. The hook part of the Velcro goes on the outside bottom and the loop part is sewn to the top. Place Velcro piece apx. 1/2" from edges and sew in place.

Cut one piece of Thin cotton batting and one piece of a cotton lining fabric 10" x 8". Layer and quilt as desired, trim and set aside.

Cut one piece of fabric 9 1/2" x 7 1/2" for inside lining of your wallet. I like to use a contrasting color.

Cut one piece of fusible stabilizer the same size and fuse to the back of this lining piece. This is an optional step but the stabilizer helps keep your wallet in better shape.

For inside pockets: Cut two pieces of fabric 7 1/2" x 7 1/2" and fold in half and press. Cut two pieces of iron on stabilizer 7" x 3 1/4". Insert in folded "pockets" to the fold. You will have apx. A fourth inch on the outside edges. Press to fuse.

For Center Pocket:

Measure up from one long edge (this will be the bottom) 4 1/2" and mark on both sides lightly with a pencil. This will be your sewing line. Take one of the folded pockets and line up the cut edge apx. one-fourth inch past your pencil marks with the folded edge towards the bottom. Pin and sew in place. Fold pocket up over the seam and press.

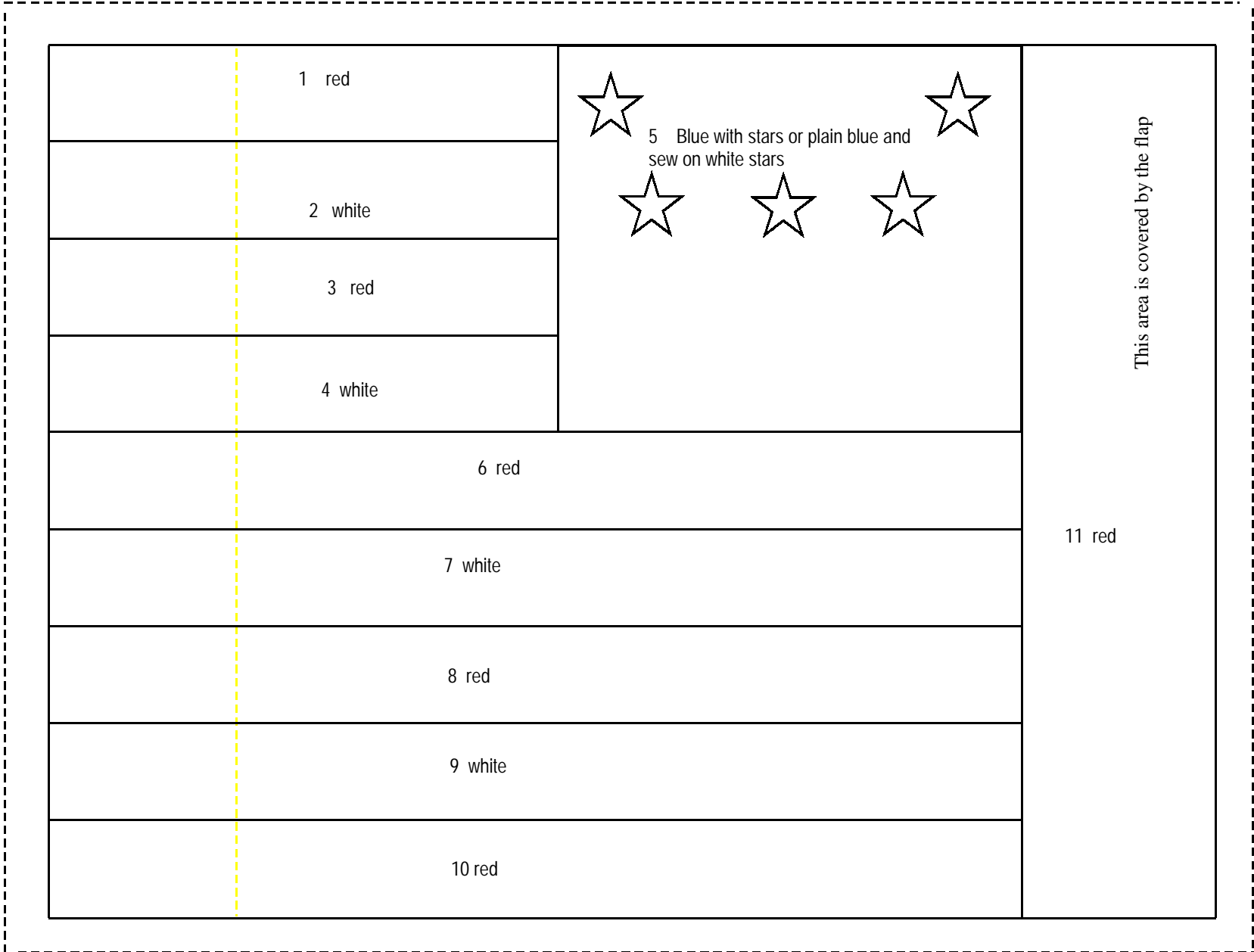
Bottom Pocket:

Line up cut edges of last pocket with bottom edges of lining. Pin in place.

Pin upper pocket in place to keep it from flopping around.

Cut binding (straight or bias) about 40" to 42" long

Layer pocket side and quilted side with wrong sides facing each other. Pin together and sew on binding on the quilted side of your wallet first. This will smoothen edges on the outside of your wallet. Finish sewing the binding to the inside of your wallet and enjoy! Toni



**Leave one end open to turn your wallet or bind your wallet after the front and inside are finished. To make the pockets stiffer us an iron on stabilizer in the pocket after they are folded in half. Use Velcro or ties for wallet closures.**
